Located on the crest of the Great Himalayas of southern Asia and lying on the border between Nepal and the Tibet Autonomous Region of China, Mount Everest is the highest mountain in the world, **(22)** ---- an elevation of 8,850 metres. Like other high peaks in the region, Mount Everest **(23)** ---- by local communities where its name means “Goddess Mother of the World” or “Goddess of the Valley”. Its identity as the highest point on the Earth was not recognized, **(24)** ----, until 1852, when the governmental Survey of India established that fact. The summit of Everest itself is covered by rock-hard snow surmounted by a layer of softer snow that fluctuates annually **(25)** ---- some 1.5–6 metres; the snow level is highest in September and lowest in May after having been depleted by the strong north-westerly winter winds. The summit and upper slopes sit so high in the Earth’s atmosphere that the amount of breathable oxygen there is one-third what it is at sea level. Lack of oxygen, powerful winds, and extremely cold temperatures **(26)** ---- the development of any plant or animal life there.
