Honeybees communicate by dancing in the direction of a food source without formal instruction. Other examples include animal fighting, animal courtship behavior, internal escape functions, and the building of nests. Mahatma Gandhi (6) ---- his life to discovering and pursuing truth, and called his movement "satyagraha", which means "appeal to, insistence on, or reliance on the Truth." It was the satyagraha formulation that deeply resonated with beliefs and culture of his people, and embedded him (7) ---- the popular consciousness as well as transforming him quickly into Mahatma. Gandhi based Satyagraha on the Vedantic ideal of self-realization, ahimsa (nonviolence), vegetarianism, and universal love. Bruce Watson states that some of these ideas are found not just in traditions within Hinduism, but in Jainism or Buddhism as well, (8) ---- those about nonviolence, vegetarianism and universal love. Gandhi's synthesis was to politicise these ideas. Gandhi stated that the most important battle to fight was overcoming his own demons, fears, and insecurities. Gandhi summarised his beliefs first when he said "God is Truth". (9) ----, he would later change this statement to "Truth is God". satya (truth) in Gandhi's philosophy is "God". Gandhi described the term "God" not as a separate power, (10) ---- as the Being of the Advaita Vedanta tradition, a nondual universal that pervades in all things, in each person and all life.

When her mother died in 1836, George Eliot left school to help run her father's household. In 1841, she moved with her father to Coventry and lived with him his death in 1849. Eliot then travelled in Europe, eventually (26) ---- in London. In 1850, Eliot began contributing to the 'Westminster Review', a leading journal for philosophical radicals, and later became its editor. She was now at the centre of a literary circle through which she met George Henry Lewes, with whom she lived until his death in 1878. Lewes was married and their relationship caused a scandal.
