Our prehistoric ancestors are often portrayed as savages who displayed no civilized behaviour at all, but the earliest human societies are likely to have been founded on the principle of equality, according to scientists. A recent study has shown that in hunter-gatherer tribes, men and women had equal influence on where and how their group lived or whom they would live with. The findings challenge the decades-long view that sexual equality is a recent invention, suggesting that it has been the norm for humans for most of our evolutionary history. Mark Dyble, an anthropologist who led the study at University College London, said: "There is still this wide perception that hunter-gatherers are more macho or male-dominated. We are not ready to adopt the opinion that it was only with the emergence of agriculture when people could start to accumulate resources, that inequality emerged." Dyble says the latest findings suggest that equality between the sexes may have been a survival advantage and played an important role in shaping human society and evolution. "The equality between the two sexes is one of an important part of changes to social organization and it distinguishes humans from the rest of the animal kingdom," he said. Sexual equality may have also proved an evolutionary advantage for early human societies for it helps foster wider-ranging social networks and closer cooperation between unrelated individuals.
